As the book points out, space exploration involves teamwork, blending the talents of many people. Imagine them launching the spacecraft that will travel around 28,000 miles per hour! That is 50 times faster than an airplane.

Although astronauts are the public face of space missions, did you know it takes thousands of people working behind the scenes to make a space mission successful? Roles include preparing nutritious meals, developing systems that provide air and water, protecting astronauts from radiation, and ensuring communications with Earth.

SKETCH SOME OF THE MANY JOBS IT TAKES TO LAUNCH A SPACE MISSION.

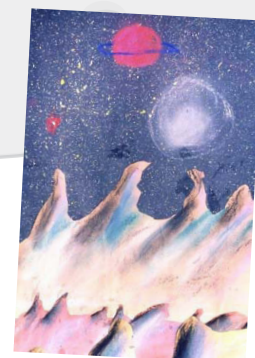
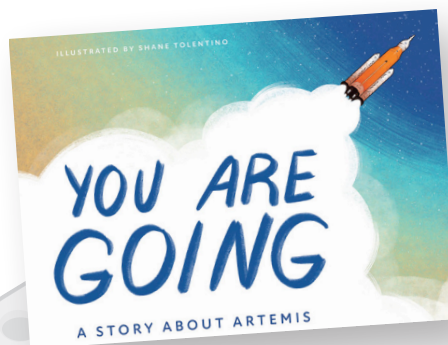
